Your artifact box should include:

1. A travel brochure for your state on one piece of paper, folded into three sections. Tell your reader why we should visit your state. What are the main attractions? What should we be sure to do while we are there?
2. At least one other item related to your state; this could be your state's quarter, something regarding a famous person from your state, a picture of a place you have visited in your state, etc...
